Saigon, May 8—The Vietnamese Communists are preparing to launch their own peace counter-offensive diplomatically and internally within South Vietnam in the coming months, reliable sources report.

bloc, although it might pave the way for those in the long-range future.

Reliable sources said they do not expect any new political proposals in the peace counter-offensive which would indicate substantial concessions or a softening of their previous positions. The sources predict the Communists would simply re-state and elaborate on their previous positions, hoping that the political tide would turn in their favor internationally-especially in America—while the political and military situation becomes more favorable to them within South of Vietnam.
