Informed sources believe the America Allied commend has the situation basically under control at this time, some Vietnamese sources believe the small-unit Communist activity will continue at least for another month-no matter what happens at the Paris talks. Official sources believe the next few days-before the beginning of the Paris talks-will be the militarily pivotal ones, with the Communists faced with three choices: either to reinforce their stal units now in the city, to withdraw their units or to run the risk of losing them. But, Vietnamese sources see as a fourth alternative—and a growing reality—that the Communists have de-escalated their larger units into roving bands of three to six which are capable to carrying on sniping, harrassing, and if equipped, high-impact mortaring on see selected targets at will for a long duration.

Informed sources refuse to estimate we many Communists in organized units are currently in the city. A preliminary estimate made Monday we already seems out of date. The thelicopter rocket and machinegun runs began at 3:30 in the morning—which sent Saigonese tossing in their beds and or running to their believely balconies—and twelve hours later a tornado—shaped smoke cloud ascended from the area and hovered over Cholon.
