SAIGON, JULY 22-An American real-life legend in Asia has returned to the United States. But, discreet predictions are being made that he will return to Vietnam when his friend is elected the new American President this year. The name: Edward G. Land Lansdale. He was the model for the famed Colonel Hillandale, the fa legendary rag-time kid in the "Org "Ugly American" as well as the model for the college-graduate-turned-diplomat in Graham Greene's "The Quiet American." Lansdale was known as the kingmaker of Philippine President Ramon Magsaysay during the pro-Communist Huk insurrection there after World War II. Then, he moved to South Vietnam to advise President Ngo Dinh Diem, since deposed. After a long absence, Lansdale returned to Vietnam in 1965 as a special liaiso liaison officer for the American Ambassador. His advise was largely ignored in American circles. Known as a hawk, he nonetheless disagreed with the predominantly military emphasis of American strategy. He left Vietnam last month, but informed sources predict he will be assigned an important post-possibly even Ambassador-in Vietnam following the American elections. He is a close friend of both leading Presidential candidates-HH Humphrey and Richard Nixon.

Last spring, the Thai government scheduled in Bangkok a surprise conference of American Peace Corps volunteers, some of whom speak the language of tribal minorities better than Thai officials and are more closely involved with the minority groups than any other American agency. While absent from their areas of work in north and northeast Thailand, the Thai government reportedly made extensive napalm and bombing raids in the so- socalled "insurgency areas" north and northeast of Bangkok. The Peace Corps volunteers were the flabbergasted when they returned from their conference. And when Thai officials surveyed the results on the ground, they were reportedly "shocked" at the minimal damage done to the "insurgents" and the terrible distruction deen done to its own territory. Now, much to f the relief of American officials, the Thai government has "moved away" from this destructive policy, informed sources report.
