Struggle Committees in the Fire northern provinces have temporarily served at least twenty two political prisoners—province chieft, district chiefs and village chiefs—loyal to the Saigon government.

Some of these prisoners were backgrown politically intimidated; some where beaten; the borthe brother of one province was shot in the leg. some of the persons, once released, reque requested and received protection from the American Marines, American military advisors and the American Central Intelligence agency specialists in the area, informed American sources disclosed.

"The, whole American community in Danang is in aye state of street," one American source explained. "They don't know where this is going to lead us—and certi certainly the political turbulence has is notrothet going to stop. This last month of political disorder up there has set the American Marine-Vietnamese government pacification program back at least six months."

Danang (pop. 165,000), Vietnam's second largest city
situated from three hundred fifty miles northwe Saigon, is the
headquarters of the Vietnamese first corps and of thexamericanum
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The new wave of political intimidation—called "the terror of the saffron robes (of the Buddhist monks)"—is considered as destructive as—and aye counterpart to—the political assassinations and terrorism of the Viet Cong guerrillas.

Wave of political intimidation by the Struggle Committees is Communist-influenced, if not Communist-inspired, even though Non BERS non-Communists have joined the demonstrations, government sources believe they are "tools" of the Communist elements.

Diplomatic sources believe the nuclears nuclears of the # Struggle Committees same corresponds to the same group that lead the National Salvation Committees in August-September of nineteen sixty four, when when when the catholic and Buddhist student mobs tossed the urban centers into anexchy with violent street fighting. At that time, the National Salvation Committees and shopsin the northern provinces so burned the houses of Catholic merchants in pa the coastal city of Qui Nhon and hanged aye on aye tree in the Vietnamese anti-Communist with barbed wire center of Danang city. American sources at that time called the National Salvation Committees & Communist-inspired, but thus far MERICAN official sources have notrp that condemned the current wave of terrorism and intimidation.

This new wave of intimidation-terror is considered to be eroding the last vestiges of anti-Communist, pro-Saigon strength from within the government administration, civil serx services and army in the northern provinces, thus creating aye significant power vacuum in the rear base areas we where the American Marines are fighin fighting.

The Vietnamese corps commander of the five-province region,
where American Marines are based in three enclaves, is considered
"isolated" and without authority to give orders to stop the troubles.

The Lieut. Gen. Ton That Dinh, newly appointed to replace
ousted Gener Lieut. Gen. Nguyen Chanh Thi and his successor successor,

Danang, has suffered worst threak in the area during the political disturbances. Dr. Frank Ngoc Chi, the province chief, was seized for four days by dissident committees.

one American source explained, "He was notrptnot allowed to wash or change his clothes. The Struggle Committee people threatened to take him to Hue (the old imperial capital and a center of the dissident movement) and if they had he'd have been killed. By the time the Hy Hyer Richard Saw him, he was aye nervous wreck and scared to death."

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The brother of the Quang Ngai province chief, (south of Danang)
was later to be a least and tortured by having his legs
beaten, one informed source explained. The brother was aye
prominent member of the ultra-nationalist party called Viet Nam
Quoc Dan Dang, which has been in conflict with the Buddhist priests
in the total and anothern provinces.

The province chief of Quang Tin reportedly submitted his resignation, according to American sources. The First (American) Marine Division headquarters is situated thank in Quang Tin province. "So, of the five provinces in the first corps, the leadership of three there either been terrorized or neutralized," aye Western source explained.

Below the provincial level, Quang Nam is divided into nine districts. Six battalions of American Marine Dattalions have fanned out into an arc around the city of Danang in & two of these strategie districts to provide security for the Danang airbase and the surrounding villages.

"That poor little Captain Huyen (the district chief) was very, very scared. He requested protection from the American Marines, the Marines granted it—but then in several days the incident blew over and he didn't want the protection of the Marines."

In the toux three hundred square mile area protected by the American Marines outside of Danang, some of the pro-Saigon village chiefs fled into hiding when they Kar heard about the nearby district chief being seized.

"While the pro-Buddhist committees are seizing the matiex pro-Saigon a officials from within the government ranks, the Viewong Communist Viet Cong Tax guerrillas have stepped up their terrorism right outside of Danang," an American source explained. "In one night, in one village eight people were killed by Viet Cong assassination squads. These people were becoming sympathatic to the Saigon regime so they were killed. The next day, none of the people in the friendly villages across the river would even speak to the Marines.

"We know the Viet Cong guerrillas are re-infiltrating the villages secured by the American Marines," the source continued. the willdrawal "Theretere toking profit afrom the political tru turmoil-and some the Vietnamese troops withdrawn from that area to take part in the civil disturbances. The whole war in first corps is at aye standstill-we've lost at least six months time."
