In early May, Viet Cong entered the village of Bu Jiai in Phuoc Long province, burned all the 70 homes—the ashes smouldered for ten days, eywi eyewitnessers said—and then they forced 239 Montagnards—some of Cambold Cambodian origin—onto a dozen trucks and drove off towards the Cambodian border. An unknown number who ru refused the truck i ride were executed on the spot.

On May 22, two local Viet Cong companies—C-103 and K16/C3 repeat
Kry K16/C3—atta attacked to the refugee village of Phuoc Ninh, burned
52 of the 100 homes of the 170-1 1700 immait inhabitants and destroyed all the
food in the village. The village was saved when a company of the 33rd
Vietnamese Ranger battalion rushed into the vill flaming area and drove out the
Communists. Part of the Ranger success was credited to their unit sha
having just been issued M-16 rifles—and the surprised the Communists with the
increased volumne of firepower. Casualties were light on all sides. Three
Viet Cong dead were left behind, but many blood trails lead into the jungle.
