"If peace means using money for road-buildingxfor and living for pleasure, we will never have peace. We will not always have a big army, but we will have a strong one. Our people will always be vigilant."

Madame Nhu, busy with activities for Women's Day on March 11, said the national holidays and r festivities in South Vietnam honored national heroex who had fought the Chinese. Since these holidays are not seedlebrated in South Minamum North-Vietnam, we celebrate them actively here, she said, tho many of the heroes were really born in North Vietnam.
